We call it the plan.




The plan says how we will make Eurobodalla Shire more **inclusive**.




Inclusive means everyone can join in and feel like they belong.

4. We want to make information and services easier.










A hearing loop is a system that helps people hear better in public places.

- people living with disability




- families and carers

There will be **mobility mats** on those beaches.

We will also help some people with kidney disease with their care at home.

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
3. We want to help people with disability find work

• do well in their job or business.






We want people with disability to have access to information that is easy to understand.


